
YEARLY INCREASE IN ENROLMENT







DISTRIBUTION OF SHOES & SWEATERS

n Winter, barefooted kids without sweaters, walking to a government school, is a common sight in Pakistan. Government schools are populated by a bulk of poor family kids who cannot afford proper clothing and shoes. These children are frequently attracted to fungi, viruses and several illnesses that cause serious harm to their health. Giving needy children clothes and shoes is an efficient approach to protect their bodies.

In **2016**, PEN launched a project to provide **free-of-cost** clothing and shoes to kids in its adopted schools. Since then, we have provided almost 4,000 PEN students with 3,000 pairs of shoes, socks and 3,000 sweaters.

We aim to provide shoes and clothing to needy children attending public schools in rural Pakistan. Our children are happier when they wear warm clothes and stay active. Furthermore, it greatly reduces the financial burden on the parents who might worry that they won't be able to dress-up their children appropriately. The school administration appreciates our initiative that develops a sense of pride and affection in the students.

n their existing infrastructure and have an immediate impact on the student population by implementing our reforms and programs. We believe that instead of investing resources in 'brick and mortar, we can leverage the existing infrastructure of public schools.

Progressive Education Network adopted **151** public schools from PEIMA under the project **Public School Support Program** (PSSP) in 14 districts of Punjab. We ensure quality of education by introducing reformatory initiatives, capacity building, efficient utilization of existing public-sector facilities.







BECOMING AN INTELLECTUAL LEAD

The most crucial information regarding the two fundamental aspects of this research are Development and Reforms. The word development is the process of developing education, growing, or changing the direction of work while reforms are the amendment of the existing educational policies and procedures, improved form or condition, or change from worse to better.

It is widely accepted that Kazakhstan places a high priority on education. The common goal of educational development and reforms in Kazakhstan is to adapt the education system to new socio- economic environment and increase the competitiveness of education and development of human capital through ensuring access to quality education for sustainable economic growth. The President of Kazakhstan has also set a task on the accession of the republic to the club of 50 most competitive countries in the world. As global experience shows, investments in human capital, and, in particular, in education, starting from an early age to a mature age, results in significant benefit for the economy and society. There are many facts, linking education and economic development: a review of international research in macro- and microeconomics proves that there is a close link between education, salaries, and productivity and various studies prove that investing in the education is most vital act to develop the society and a great chance to get back your investment financial and non-financial way(s). It is noteworthy to mention that the first step in determining your return on investment (ROI) in schooling is at an early level.

Expanding access to education: Kazakhstan has worked towards improving access to education, especially in rural areas and for disadvantaged groups. Measures have been taken to build more schools in inaccessible areas, provide scholarships, furniture, teaching kits, Labs, and financial assistance to students from underprivileged backgrounds, and increase enrollment rates.

The curriculum has been updated to include the competences and practical abilities that employers are looking for

Integration of Technology: In an effort to improve teaching and learning, Kazakhstan is progressively incorporating technology into its classrooms. This includes providing schools
